1 Thess 5:12-15

## 2 Core Values of Interdependent People

1. Interdependent people appreciate their leaders (vs12-13).

### 3 Reasons Why

1. They work hard to the point of exhaustion.
2. They lead with a sense of responsibility.
3. They challenge you to do what is right.

### 2 Ways to Show It

1. Do whatever it takes to show your love for them
2. Do whatever it takes to be at peace with them

2. Interdependent people accept responsibility for others (vs14-15).

### 4 Relational Responsibilities

1. We are to challenge those out of line.
2. We are to support the discouraged.
3. We are to stabilize the weak.
4. We are to respond to each other, not react.
