Philippians 3:17-4:1

Key Idea: i run for my colors means I live out my citizenship.

Godly models give us a clear pattern to imitate (v.17)

Two Patterns:

Destiny Destruction

mind = earth

god = stomach

glory = shame

Citizen of Heaven

mind = eternal

God = Jesus

glory = service

God's power gives us hope to grow (v.21)

4. Do you believe that God has the power to establish His kingdom on earth? Do you believe that God has the power to establish His kingdom in your life?
